Health & Temperament Guarantee

Letter of Warranty

Dear Moonstruck Bernedoodle Buyer;

Thank you for purchasing a quality bred dog from Moonstruck Bernedoodles. Below are the terms under which your dog is covered under our breeder's Health & Temperament Guarantee.

- 1) This Health & Temperament Guarantee is not transferable from the original purchaser of the puppy.
- 2) This dog has a life time guarantee against the following genetic diseases:

Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA)

Von Willebrand Disease (vWD)

Degenerative Myopathy (DM)

If this dog is, at any time during his/her lifetime, diagnosed with the above genetic diseases, proof of illness is required in the form of DNA testing and a written letter from the veterinarian who performed the DNA swab as well as a formal diagnosis from a veterinary specialist in the field of the particular disease.

- 3) This dog has a limited 12 month Temperament Guarantee. If the dog is found to be of poor temperament a replacement puppy will be provided from the next available litter (no refunds will be given) providing the following stipulations are met: a certificate from a Veterinary Behaviour Specialist, or trainer of the Seller's choosing, must be provided to the Seller stating the puppy is overly shy or fearful due to genetic, inherited temperament, NOT poor socialization; proof of euthanasia (if applicable), spay or neuter (if applicable) is provided to the Seller. Seller reserves the right to examine the dog herself at no charge to the owner. Warranty on temperament expires when the dog turns 12 months of age.
- 4) This dog is warranted until 30 months of age to be free of genetic disease that would cause severe disability or death. If the dog is found, conclusively by two veterinarians (one of the Buyers choosing and one of the Sellers choosing), to have a genetic disease that will cause severe disability or death, seller will replace the dog with one of equal value, OR ½ of the original purchase price of the dog stated in the Purchase Contract.

- 5) This dog is guaranteed to pass OFA Hip Evaluation, achieving a rating of Excellent, Good or Fair and a Normal Elbow rating. This guarantee expires at 30 months of age. Ratings of Severe Hip or Elbow Dysplasia will result in the replacement of the dog with the following stipulations: Proof of claim must be supported by the OFA report, at the Buyer's expense. If proven, the buyer need NOT return the puppy to the Seller, but must submit a certificate of spay or neuter (if applicable) before compensation will be considered. Compensation shall consist of a replacement puppy of equal value from the next available litter. Ratings of Borderline or Mild Hip or Elbow Dysplasia will result in compensation equal to ½ the original purchase price of the puppy. Warranty on hips and elbows is VOID if: The puppy is not raised on a balanced (veterinary approved) raw meat or premium brand kibble; if the dog is bred prior to OFA certification, if the dog is heavily exercised prior to 18 months of age or if the dog is not kept lean (ribs should be easily felt, not searched for). Proof of diet in the form of receipts from when the dog was a puppy to time of diagnosis will be required before compensation will be considered.
- 6) This dog is warranted against Entropion and Distichiasis. The dog must be diagnosed by a Veterinary Ophthalmologist and the results sent to the Seller. If the dog requires corrective surgery for these conditions, compensation will be upto \$1, 000 CDN paid directly to the Veterinarian.
- 7) This Health & Temperament Guarantee does not warranty the following:
 - Skin/Food/Environment Allergies
 - Improper bites
 - Viral illnesses, infections, parasites (Dog is guaranteed free of these at time of ownership transfer.)
 - Hypoglycemia
 - Diabetes
 - Hernias
 - Mild Heart Murmurs
 - Cancer

The above Health & Temperament Guarantee is valid only if the conditions of the Purchase Contract are upheld.

Warranty on the dog is void if the dog is in any way abused, neglected, allowed to become overweight, over exercised, over vaccinated, does not receive regular veterinary care, fed a low quality diet and/or is not formally trained and socialized.
